OTHER SPECIAL CASES:

SAN DIEGO, CA - A member recently told us the city of San Diego is choosing not to enforce their "no swine" law when it might apply to potbellied pigs. The city unofficially accepts them as long as they are kept as pets and do not cause problems.

SPRINGFIELD, MO - Another member told us while Springfield did not pass a special potbellied pig ordinance, they did add potbellies to the list of accepted pets allowed in the city. Their owners will be held to the same requirements as owners of dogs and cats are.

ROYAL OAK, MI - A potbellied pig owner called the Royal Oak city offices and was told that if a potbellied pig was a housepet and was kept inside, the city would not have a problem with it. However, if the pig was kept outside, the owner would have to request a permit to keep it.

WASHINGTON STATE - The Washington State Department of Agriculture, in the fall of 1992, issued a new definition for the term "farm animal". They said the term applied only to animals that were used for food, labor or other production. Other states may have similar definitions on their books already.
